Base Costumes:

You will be **required** to provide a few items for your base costume. **Please bring these items to rehearsal on Tue, 6/10.** These items are below and based on what role you play.

ALL:

Shoes: Neutral color (white, grey, black, tan, navy, brown, etc) that strap onto your feet and you can move in.

Shirts: dark colored shirt without large logos or graphics.

Bottoms: dark colored bottoms without large logos or graphics that you can move easily in.

Socks (if needed with shoes): neutral color.

Eric, Grimsby, Sailors, and Chefs:

Additional bottoms: neutral colored pants, shorts, or skirts.

Gulls:

Additional bottoms: light colored pants, shorts, or skirts.

Other Notes:

Please note your costume items will live at the Arts Center throughout tech week and the run of the show.

You may bring in clothing items, accessories, or anything else you can think of! Feel free to reference the design presentation, but don't let that limit you!

Hair and Makeup:

Light stage makeup will be best (blush, mascara, foundation, basic eye shadow), and hair can be anything you'd like, but know that you will be responsible for your own products and doing

your own hair and makeup!

I encourage those who play roles that are animals or under the sea to experiment with fun hairstyles!

Long hair cannot fall in front of the face. It makes it difficult to see your face on stage and is dangerous for you!
